REGULAR MEETING SOUTH BRUNSWICK TOWNSHIP BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS – DISTRICT #2 February 16, 2016

1. CALL TO ORDER AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Spahr at 7:00 pm followed by a salute to the flag.

2. NOTICE OF COMPLIANCE

Chairman Spahr read the Public Laws Meeting Notice of the Public Laws of 1975.

3. ROLL CALL

4. PUBLIC COMMENT

No one from the floor desired to address the Board.

5. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A. January 19, 2016 Regular Meeting

Comm. Young made a motion to approve the minutes of the January 19, 2016 regular meeting, seconded by Comm. Potts.

Roll call: Comm. Potts - yes, Comm. Smith - yes, Comm. Wolfe - yes, Comm. Young - yes, Chairman Spahr - yes.

6. PROFESSIONAL REPORTS

A. Chief's Report

Chief Scott Smith reviewed the Fire Department's January 2016 activity report (see attached).

Chief Smith reported that the Fire Department's installation dinner is on Saturday February 27th. Chief Smith further reported that the Kingston Fire Company will be providing coverage during the event.

B. District Coordinator's Report

Coordinator Scott Smith reviewed the February 2016 Coordinator's Report (see attached).

C. Insurance Chairman's Report

Coordinator Smith reviewed the February 2016 Insurance Report (see attached).

D. Treasurer's Report

Comm. Young reported that there have been two deposits since the last meeting. The first deposit was made on February 3rd in the amount of \$7,144.00 from Gov Deals for the sale of the 1997 Ford F-250 pick-up truck. The second deposit was made on February 12th from the Monmouth Junction Volunteer Fire Department in the amount of \$218.50, for a check mistakenly issued by the Township to the Fire Department for reimbursement of supplies used at a hazardous materials incident.

Comm. Young reported that the 1099-MISC forms have been issued and the 1096 forms were sent to the State and Federal Government.

Comm. Young reported that the 2016 budget that was adopted last meeting was sent to the Department of Community Affairs on January 28th.

Comm. Young reported that he distributed an abbreviated financial report for expenditures thus far in 2016.

Comm. Young reported that he anticipates closing out the 2015 financials at either the reorganization meeting on March 1st or at the regular meeting on March 21st.

E. Legislative Report

Comm. Potts reported that the bill that allows fire districts in adjoining municipalities to consolidate was signed into law by the Governor.

Comm. Potts reported that the bill to allow fire districts to voluntarily move their election to the November general election has not yet been introduced.

Comm. Potts reported that he was contacted by attorney Richard Braslow regarding a situation in Cherry Hill. The Cherry Hill Fire Department bonded for and constructed a new fire house and training tower in 1980, which was approved by the Local Finance Board, with the site being listed as a training facility. Comm. Potts reported that Cherry Hill is attempting to complete a refurbishment and expansion of the training facility, but was informed by the Department of Community Affairs that they cannot have a training facility. In his conversation with Mr. Braslow, Comm. Potts informed him that our facility is listed as an approved training facility with the DCA.

7. OLD BUSINESS

A. Discussion on PSE&G Direct Install Program

Chairman Spahr reported that the District received a proposal from PSE&G for their Direct Install Program. Chairman Spahr further reported that the total cost of the project for Station 20 is \$44,469.02, with the District being responsible for \$13,340.89. Chairman Spahr reported that there is no guarantee from PSE&G that there will be an energy savings with the completion of the project. Chairman Spahr researched pricing to upgrade the existing lighting at Station 20 and came up with a cost of approximately \$10,000.00, not including labor.

Following Chairman Spahr's summary of the program, there was an extensive discussion on the costs and benefits of the program, as well as the items that should be addressed at Station 20 at some point, specifically the heating systems in the building.

Comm. Smith made a motion to decline the PSE&G Direct Install Program proposal, seconded by Comm. Wolfe.

Roll call: Comm. Potts - yes, Comm. Smith - yes, Comm. Wolfe - yes, Comm. Young - yes, Chairman Spahr - yes.

8. NEW BUSINESS

A. Discussion/Approval on Renewal of the Lawn Maintenance Contract

Coordinator Smith reported that he received the 2016 renewal of the lawn maintenance contract from Alan Landscaping. Coordinator Smith reported that the total cost is \$5,350.00 for the two fire stations, which is the same cost dating back to 2013. Coordinator Smith clarified that the contract is for the weekly lawn maintenance and does not include a spring or fall cleanup at the stations. Coordinator Smith recommended renewing the lawn maintenance contract with Alan Landscaping.

Comm. Young made a motion to approve the renewal of the lawn maintenance contract with Alan Landscaping in the amount of \$5,350.00, seconded by Comm. Wolfe.

Roll call: Comm. Potts - yes, Comm. Smith - yes, Comm. Wolfe - yes, Comm. Young - yes, Chairman Spahr - yes.

B. Resolution #16-02, Declaration of Surplus Equipment

Coordinator Smith reported that the two new treadmills that were ordered last year were delivered last week and recommended declaring the two old treadmills as surplus equipment for disposal.

Comm. Smith made a motion to approve Resolution #16-02, seconded by Comm. Young. Roll call: Comm. Potts - abstain, Comm. Smith - yes, Comm. Wolfe - yes, Comm. Young - yes, Chairman Spahr - yes.

Coordinator Smith recommended listing the old treadmills for two weeks on the Gov Deals auction website. Coordinator Smith further recommended listing one treadmill at a starting price of \$75.00, and the other treadmill at a starting price of \$50.00 due to the incline feature of the unit not working.

Comm. Wolfe made a motion to list the two treadmills on the Gov Deals auction website for two weeks at a starting price of \$50.00 and \$75.00, seconded by Comm. Smith.

Roll call: Comm. Potts - abstain, Comm. Smith - yes, Comm. Wolfe - yes, Comm. Young - yes, Chairman Spahr - yes.

C. Items Timely and Important

Comm. Young reminded those present of the Fire District election on Saturday February 20th from 2:00 PM to 9:00 PM and that the District re-organization meeting will be on Tuesday March 1st.

Comm. Smith reported that Vincze Home Improvement completed the installation of the chair rail and the painting of the member's room at Station 21. Comm. Smith further reported that the Fire Department will be performing some finishing touches in the room in the coming weeks.

Comm. Potts reported that the State Fire Districts Association will be meeting at Station 20 on Saturday March 5th.

Comm. Wolfe made a motion to approve the voucher list as posted, seconded by Comm. Smith.

Fire District Coordinator's Report February 16, 2016

- The buyer of the 1997 Ford F-250 picked-up the truck on 1-20-2016. All necessary paperwork was completed regarding the sale. The insurance company was contacted the same day to remove the vehicle from our coverage.
- Quick Response Fire Protection was on site on 1-21-2016 to perform the quarterly sprinkler inspection at both stations. All systems are in proper working order at this time.
- Matt Pinter Door Company was at Station 21 on 1-27-2016 to replace a broken cable on a bay door. While there, I had them replace the second cable on the same door and both cables on another door as a precaution.
- A personal trainer from Ener-G Wellness was at Station 20 on 1-28-2016 to give a second orientation session on the proper and safe use of the weight room equipment. I also reviewed the Board policy on the use of the room and had those individuals sign the Hold Harmless agreement that needed to. A total of 11 people attended this training session, which is in addition to the 29 people that attended the first session held last month.
- Donald C. Rodner, Inc. was at Station 20 on 2-10-2016 to perform the quarterly maintenance on the HVAC units. All units are in proper working order at this time.
