### A. Fire Chief's Report

Chief Scott Smith reviewed the Fire Department's September 2018 activity report (see attached).

Chief Smith reported that member Tyler DeGroff completed Firefighter I at the Middlesex County Fire Academy.

Chief Smith reported that the Fire Department has one new member, Pranabesh Sanyal.

Chief Smith reported that the Fire Department held a drill with the IFF Fire Brigade at their facility on Docks Corner Road on September 27<sup>th</sup>, which was also attended by the Kingston and Jamesburg Fire Departments.

Chief Smith reported that the Fire Department held an open house at Station 20 for fire prevention week on October 6<sup>th</sup> which was well attended by the public.

Chief Smith reported that the Kendall Park Fire Company has asked if we would house the fire safety trailer as they need room in their Henderson Road station. Chief Smith further reported that some trucks will be moved around and the trailer will be stored at Station 21.

# Fire District Coordinator's Report October 15, 2018

- Approved Fire Protection was on site on 9-18-2018 to perform the annual inspection of the fire extinguishers on the trucks and at the stations. Several extinguishers were taken for recharging and hydrostatic testing and have been returned.
- Alan Landscaping was at Station 20 on 9-24-2018 to trim the shrubs and bushes around the building.
- Following a compliance inspection in June of last year, I reported that the Air Quality Permit through the NJ DEP for Station 20's emergency generator would be expiring this year. I have completed the online renewal process and we received an invoice in the amount of \$820.00, which is on the voucher list. The permit is valid for 5 years, and additional record keeping is required as part of the conditions of the permit.
- Waterway, Inc. was on site on 9-26-2018 to perform the annual hose testing. All hose passed testing with no need to replace any lengths this year.
- Trugreen was at Station 21 on 10-4-2018 to perform a lawn treatment.
- I was contacted by the First Aid Squad the evening of 10-6-2018 and advised that a bay door at Station 21 was damaged by an ambulance backing into the building. We were able to close and secure the door and replacement panels have been ordered by Matt Pinter Door Company. The same door was replaced in May 2017 after a similar incident. I will be submitting all invoices to the First Aid Squad for reimbursement to the Fire District.
- Matt Pinter Door Company was at Station 20 on 10-9 & 10-10 and both stations on 10-15-2018 to perform preventive maintenance on the engine bay doors. One bay door at Station 20 required new springs and cables.
- Tower 201 was taken to Fire & Safety Services on 10-15-2018 for its annual preventive maintenance.
- We started fire safety presentations at the schools and day cares last week with the Fire Safety Bureau.

#### Insurance:

• The payment under the Group Term Life Insurance policy for Comm. Potts was issued by Glatfelter Claims Management, Inc. (VFIS) on 10-3-2018, closing out this claim.

WHEREAS, the Department of Community Affairs, Division of Local Government Services has set the Cost of Living Increase (COLI) for the year 2018 at a maximum of 2.1%; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Community Affairs, Division of Local Government Services has provided that those sponsoring agencies that have participated in the program since its inception in 1999 and are not at the maximum allowable amount may make such adjustments; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners of Fire District No. 2 in the Township of South Brunswick, County of Middlesex desire to increase the LOSAP contribution to its Firefighters by the allowable Cost of Living Increase; and

WHEREAS, funds are available in the 2018 budget for this purpose.
