#### 1. CALL TO ORDER AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Spahr at 7:00 pm followed by a salute to the flag.

#### 2. NOTICE OF COMPLIANCE

#### 5. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

#### A. November 19, 2018 Regular Meeting

Comm. Smith made a motion to approve the minutes of the November 19, 2018 regular meeting, seconded by Comm. Young.

Comm. Smith made a motion to approve the minutes of the December 3, 2018 special meeting, seconded by Comm. Young.

#### 6. PROFESSIONAL REPORTS

#### A. Fire Chief's Report

Chief Scott Smith reviewed the Fire Department's November 2018 activity report (see attached).

Chief Smith reported that the Fire Department held a live-burn drill at the Middlesex County Fire Academy on November 29<sup>th</sup>.

Chief Smith reported that the Fire Department performed a Santa Cade event around the district on Saturday December 8<sup>th</sup>.

Chief Smith reported that the Fire Department's line officers will stay the same for 2019. Chief Smith further thanked the Board for their support in 2018 and is looking forward to 2019.

#### B. District Coordinator's Report

Coordinator Scott Smith reviewed the December 2018 Coordinator's Report (see attached).

#### C. Insurance Chairman's Report

Coordinator Smith read the December 2018 Insurance Report (see attached).

#### D. Treasurer's Report

Comm. Young reported that there have been two deposits since the last meeting. The first deposit was made on November 30<sup>th</sup> from South Brunswick Township in the amount of \$3,074.00 for reimbursement of an equipment purchase utilizing dedicated penalty funds. The second deposit was made on December 13<sup>th</sup> in the amount of \$50.00 as a donation from resident Candice Sanchez.

Comm. Young reported that there will be two more checks coming from South Brunswick Township; one for use of the fire station for the general election and one for the fourth quarter taxation.

Comm. Young reported that he distributed the latest financial reports to the Commissioner's mailboxes earlier today. Comm. Young reported that all line items are in good shape and there will be a discussion under Timely and Important regarding a budget transfer.

#### E. Legislative Report

There was no legislative information to discuss.

#### 7. OLD BUSINESS

#### 8. NEW BUSINESS

#### A. Discussion on Chief's Request for Equipment Purchases

Chief Smith reported that the line officers have demoed several brands of thermal imaging cameras over the course of this year and would like to purchase the K2 model of camera manufactured by Flir. Chief Smith further reported that the Fire Department approved the purchase of two cameras utilizing a donation from a location church. Chief Smith requested approval from the Commissioners to order (2) additional cameras, as well as (4) vehicle chargers and (4) retractable lanyards at a cost not to exceed \$3,500.00.

Comm. Wolfe made a motion to approve the purchase of the thermal imaging cameras and accessories at a cost not to exceed \$3,500.00, seconded by Comm. Smith.

Chief Smith reported that the line officers would like to purchase a training prop that can be used to construct walls to practice hoseline advancement. Chief Smith reported that the prop is manufactured by Canvas Corners in Colorado and that he received a quote in the amount of \$3,421.00. Chief Smith further reported that the product is sold directly from the manufacturer and as such a second quote cannot be obtained.

Comm. Smith made a motion to approve the purchase of the wall training prop from Canvas Corners in the amount of \$3,421.00, seconded by Comm. Wolfe.

Chief Smith requested approval for the installation of the thermal imaging camera chargers and foot pedal siren controls in Engines 204 & 206 at a cost not to exceed \$2,500.00.

Comm. Smith made a motion to approve the installation of the chargers and siren controls at a cost not to exceed \$2,500.00, seconded by Comm. Wolfe.

# B. Discussion on VFIS Group Term Life Insurance Policy Renewal

Coordinator Smith reported he received the 2019 renewal packet for the Group Term Life Insurance policy from VFIS at a total cost of \$4,695.92, which is a decrease of \$3,139.05 from the 2018 policy cost of \$7,834.97. Coordinator Smith recommended renewing the Group Term Life Insurance policy with VFIS.

Comm. Young made a motion to renew the Group Term Life Insurance policy with VFIS at a total cost of \$4,695.92, seconded by Comm. Smith.

#### C. 2019 Budget Status

Comm. Young reported that following the approval of the 2019 budget at the special meeting two weeks ago, the budget was mailed to DCA on December 6<sup>th</sup>. Comm. Young further reported that the budget was also sent electronically and has been posted on the district's website. Comm. Young reported that he has not received any questions from the DCA regarding the budget as of yet.

Coordinator Smith reported that he spoke with a representative from the County Clerk's office last month and was informed that they may need up to 1,000 ballots for those that request a mail-in ballot due to changes in the law. Coordinator Smith further reported that he left a message last week for an update but has not heard back. Coordinator Smith reported that he has obtained a quote from a local vendor to print ballots for the fire district election that are sequentially numbered and perforated.

# Fire District Coordinator's Report December 17, 2018

- A mechanic from Fire & Safety Services was on site on 11-26-2018 to address several minor issues on both Engines 204 & 206. Both trucks still have to go to their shop to address pump issues, which should be sometime in early January.
- Matt Pinter Door Company was at Station 21 on 11-26-2018 to replace a damaged coil cord for a bay door safety sensor.
- One of our thermal imaging cameras was dropped off at Continental Fire & Safety on 11-27-2018 to be shipped back to Bullard (manufacturer) for diagnosis and repair of a an issue with the display. The camera was purchased in March 2016 and should still be under warranty.
- Two plumbers from the Board of Education were at Station 20 on 11-30-2018 to replace an automatic flush sensor on a urinal in the men's bathroom.
- I dropped off the recorder for the sound system in the meeting room at Station 20 to RHA Communications to diagnose an issue with the machine. They will provide a quote to repair and also a quote to upgrade to a digital recorder.
- A tech from Donald C. Rodner, Inc. was at Station 20 on 12-10-2018 to perform the quarterly maintenance on the HVAC units. A thermostat had to be adjusted on one system and all are in proper working order at this time.
- Engine 208 was taken to Campbell Supply Company on 12-11-2018 to troubleshoot an engine power issue.
- Cummins Power Systems was on site on 12-12-2018 to perform the 6-month preventive maintenance of the emergency generators at both stations.
- A rep from the Township Data Processing office was at Station 20 on 12-12-2018 to troubleshoot and repair a poor connection on one of the phones in the communications room.

#### Insurance:

- As reported last month, one of our members suffered a foot injury on 11-13-2018 while attending Firefighter I at the Somerset County Fire Academy. The member went for two follow-up visits at Brunswick Urgent Care and as the injury had not healed, he was referred to an orthopedic doctor. He was diagnosed with a fractured bone in his right foot and was given an air cast.
- There is an item under new business for discussion on renewal of the VFIS Group Term Life Insurance Policy.

#### **RESOLUTION 18-27**

#### Adoption of Temporary Budget for 2019

WHEREAS, it has become necessary for the Commissioners of Fire District No. 2 in the Township of South Brunswick, County of Middlesex, by resolution, to adopt a temporary budget to make appropriations and to provide for the period between the beginning of the fiscal year, January 1, 2019, and the adoption of the budget by the legal voters of the fire district, which election is scheduled for February 16, 2019;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it RESOLVED by the Commissioners of Fire District No. 2 in the Township of South Brunswick, County of Middlesex, as follows:

(1) A temporary budget is hereby adopted to be effective from the beginning of the fiscal year as noted above and to be in full force and effect until the adoption of the annual fire district budget as referenced above; the total of the appropriations of the temporary budget to reflect not in excess of 14% of the total of the appropriations made for all purposes in the budget for the preceding fiscal year exclusive of appropriations for interest and debt redemption charges and capital improvements.
