# REGULAR MEETING SOUTH BRUNSWICK TOWNSHIP BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS – DISTRICT #2 June 17, 2019

### A. Fire Chief's Report

Chief Scott Smith reviewed the Fire Department's May 2019 activity report (see attached).

Chief Smith reported that there were recent failures of the Township's radio system, with the Data Processing office working on correcting the problem. Chief Smith further reported that the fire departments obtained radios from the County Fire Marshal's office to operate on the county radio system in the event of another failure. Chief Smith reported that Data Processing has been working on putting together options to replace the current radio system, which is no longer supported by the manufacturer, and that they are working on funding for replacement radios.

# A. Discussion on Purchase of Equipment for Operations

Chief Smith requested permission to purchase a turnout gear dryer for Station 21 from Dry Gear Solutions in the amount of \$7,383.98.

Chief Smith requested permission to purchase (4) sets of turnout gear; (2) sets of Globe turnout gear from Continental Fire & Safety at a cost of \$2,918.00 each for a total of \$5,836.00; (2) sets of Quaker Safety turnout gear from First Battalion Firefighting-Equipment, LLC at a cost of \$2,517.20 each for a total of \$5,034.40.

Comm. Smith made a motion to approve the purchase of (4) sets of turnout gear at a cost not to exceed \$11,000.00, seconded by Comm. Wolfe.

Comm. Smith reported that the Fire Department's auditor submitted the required tax paperwork to the IRS and that the audit of the 2018 financials should be completed by next month's Fire District meeting, in accordance with the fire protection contract.

Comm. Young reported that he spoke with the President of the Fire Department and recommended the formation of a committee to negotiate a new fire protection contract, as the current 3-year contract expires at the end of this year.

# Fire District Coordinator's Report June 17, 2019

- Donald C. Rodner, Inc. was at Station 20 on 5-23-2019 to perform the quarterly preventive maintenance on the HVAC systems.
- TruGreen performed a lawn treatment at Station 21 on 5-24-2019.
- White Brothers Masonry was at Station 20 for several days starting on 6-2-2019 to pour the concrete pad for the storage shed. Prior to that we contacted NJ One Call to obtain the proper mark-outs for the excavation. The shed is scheduled to be delivered on 6-18-2019.
- Paramount Exterminating Co. was at Station 20 on 6-3-2019 to perform a treatment of the kitchen and engine bays.
- Station 20 was used as a polling location for the primary election on 6-4-2019.
- As reported last month, Engine 208 was taken to Campbell Supply Co. on 5-20-2019. The truck was back on 6-4-2019 after having several pump items addressed, as well as the replacement of the cab lift cylinders.
- Fire Security Technologies performed the sensitivity testing of the smoke detectors at both fire stations on 6-6-2019. They also replaced the heat detectors at both stations due to their age as well as the back-up batteries in the alarm system at Station 20.
- Car 210 (2005 Ford Expedition) was taken to East Coast Emergency Lighting on 610-2019 to have the computer and mount removed. This computer will replace the
  computer installed in Car 200 (2014 Chevy Tahoe), with that car's current computer
  moved to the new chief's vehicle. The new chief's car was delivered today, and I
  completed the registration paperwork and obtained the license plates from the MVC.
  I am in the process of compiling information on the 2005 Expedition and will come
  back to the Board with disposal options next month.
- Tasc Fire Apparatus was at Station 20 on 6-12-2019 to perform the annual preventive maintenance of the Hurst rescue tools.
- Hicks Communications was at Station 20 on 6-13-2019 to troubleshoot a problem with one of the phone lines. After checking the equipment, it is believed the problem is either with the Verizon service or the building's alarm system that uses that one phone line. A tech from Verizon was on site on 6-14-2019 and determined that there was a short with the one phone line, which has been repaired. While on site, the tech from Hicks stated that the building's phone system is in good condition and does not recommend changing any equipment at this time.

• Karl's Tire Service was at Station 20 on 6-14-2019 to replace a tire valve stem on Engine 208.

#### Insurance:

- There is an invoice on the Voucher List to Glatfelter Specialty Benefits in the amount of \$1,439.00 for the third installment on the Group Term Life Insurance Policy.
- As an update to our member who was involved in an accident in his personal vehicle when returning from the fire academy on 5-18-2019, the invoice to Brunswick Urgent Care will be paid by VFIS under the Accident & Sickness policy. VFIS will also pay the tow company fees. We are waiting on a determination as to whether the member's personal vehicle will be repaired.
- I contacted VFIS and the new Chief's vehicle was added to our coverage effective today. We received the insurance card and will be receiving the invoice shortly. I also contacted VFIS about adding the new storage shed and we will likewise be receiving an invoice shortly.
