REGULAR MEETING SOUTH BRUNSWICK TOWNSHIP BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS – DISTRICT #2 August 17, 2020

1. CALL TO ORDER AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Spahr at 7:00 pm followed by a salute to the flag.

2. NOTICE OF COMPLIANCE

5. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A. July 20, 2020 Regular Meeting

Comm. Smith made a motion to approve the minutes of the July 20, 2020 regular meeting, seconded by Comm. Wolfe.

6. PROFESSIONAL REPORTS

A. Fire Chief's Report

Chief Scott Smith reviewed the Fire Department's July 2020 activity report (see attached).

Chief Smith reported that the Fire Department has one new member, Jorge Robles.

Chief Smith reported that following last month's presentation to the Board, a truck committee was formed and a meeting was held with a salesman from Fire & Safety Services to review the different aerial platform models offered by Pierce. Chief Smith further reported that the committee will be looking at several new aerial trucks that were delivered in the state in the coming weeks.

B. District Coordinator's Report

Coordinator Scott Smith reviewed the August 2020 Coordinator's Report (see attached).

C. Insurance Chairman's Report

Coordinator Smith reviewed the August 2020 Insurance Report (see attached).

D. Treasurer's Report

Comm. Young reported that he distributed the latest financial reports to the Commissioner's mailboxes earlier today.

8. NEW BUSINESS

A. Discussion on Purchase of Equipment for Operations

Chief Smith requested permission to purchase one Fire Hooks Unlimited Hydra Ram forcible entry tool from Continental Fire & Safety in the amount of \$2,185.00.

Comm. Smith made a motion to approved the purchase of the Hydra Ram forcible entry tool from Continental Fire & Safety in the amount of \$2,185.00, seconded by Comm. Young. Roll call: Comm. Kazanski - yes, Comm. Smith - yes, Comm. Wolfe - yes, Comm. Young - yes, Chairman Spahr - yes. Motion Passed.

Chief Smith requested permission to purchase two Streamlight portable LED scene lights from Continental Fire & Safety for \$621.00 each and a total cost of \$1,242.00.

Comm. Wolfe made a motion to approved the purchase of two Streamlight portable LED scene lights from Continental Fire & Safety at a total cost of \$1,242.00, seconded by Comm. Kazanski.

B. Discussion on Capital Projects

Coordinator Smith reported that he has been researching several potential capital projects. The first project is an upgrade to the vehicle exhaust removal system at Station 20, as the current system could not be connected to a new bay door motor that was installed last year. Coordinator Smith reported that Chairman Spahr is working on connecting the system to the bay door motor and believes the upgrades will not be necessary.

Coordinator Smith reported that once the traffic signal preemption equipment is installed inside Station 21, he intends to research advanced warning devices that could be installed on Georges Road.

Coordinator Smith reported that he has been in contact with five different companies to obtain information on the installation of LED message boards at both stations to replace the current signs. Coordinator Smith provided drawings and quotes received from the sign

companies, and reported that he will be meeting with electrical contractors. After a brief discussion, Coordinator Smith will provide additional information and pricing details at an upcoming meeting.

Comm. Young reviewed financial information he compiled regarding the capital reserve component inventory, current available capital reserve funds, and a future projection of capital funds and possible capital expenditures. Comm. Young developed the information to aid in future budget planning and in response to the Fire Chief's presentation last month regarding the vehicle replacement schedule. Following the review of the financial information, a discussion was held on the possible move of the fire district election from February to the general election in November, and the subsequent changes that would result to the budget and capital expenditure approval process. Comm. Young will compile more information for additional discussion at next month's meeting.

C. Items Timely and Important

Fire District Coordinator's Report August 17, 2020

- A mechanic from Fire & Safety Services was on site for several days starting 8-3-2020 to install the Knox key secure boxes in Tower 201 and Engines 204, 206 & 208, which was approved earlier this year. The key secure boxes were installed in the chief's vehicles on 8-13-2020 by East Coast Emergency Lighting. The key secure boxes were provided by the Fire Official who will also be reimbursing the Fire District for the cost of their installation. One of the fire inspectors will be programming the boxes in the near future.
- Trugreen performed a lawn treatment at Station 21 on 8-6-2020.
- Alan Landscaping removed multiple downed tree limbs from behind Station 21 on 8-11-2020 that fell due to Hurricane Isaias.
- Fire Security Technologies performed the annual fire alarm system testing at both stations on 8-12-2020. All systems are in proper working order with no repairs needed.
- A tech from Airmatic Compressor Corp. was at Station 20 on 8-12-2020 to perform a service of the air compressor/dryer, which was last performed almost 5 years ago. A refrigerant leak was found during the service. They will be providing a quote to make the necessary repairs.
- Chairman Spahr and I met with representatives from several groups on 8-12-2020 to
 discuss the installation of preemption equipment inside Station 21 to control the
 traffic signal at the Georges Road & Route 522 intersection as part of the county's reengineering project. The equipment will be ordered and should be installed in the
 next month or so.

Insurance:

• We received formal notification from VFIS that the bond coverage was increased from \$1.5 million to \$2.0 million effective 7-22-2020 at no additional charge, as approved by the Board last month.
