REGULAR MEETING SOUTH BRUNSWICK TOWNSHIP BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS – DISTRICT #2 November 15, 2021

4. PUBLIC COMMENT

5. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A. October 18, 2021 Regular Meeting

Comm. Smith made a motion to approve the minutes of the October 18, 2021 regular meeting, seconded by Comm. Young.

6. PROFESSIONAL REPORTS

A. Fire Chief's Report

Chief Scott Smith reviewed the Fire Department's October 2021 activity report (see attached).

Chief Smith reported that two line officers attended a swift water rescue awareness class in Kingston on October 18th. Chief Smith further reported that the department will most likely hold the awareness class for all firefighters at some point in the new year.

Chief Smith reported that the Fire Department held a live-burn drill at the Mercer County Fire Academy on October 28th.

B. District Coordinator's Report

Coordinator Scott Smith reviewed the November 2021 Coordinator's Report (see attached).

C. Insurance Chairman's Report

Coordinator Smith reviewed the November 2021 Insurance Report (see attached).

D. Treasurer's Report

Comm. Young reported that there was one deposit since the last meeting. The deposit was made on November 2nd from South Brunswick Township in the amount of \$291.86 for reimbursement of supplies used at a hazardous materials incident.

Comm. Young reported that he distributed the latest financial reports to the Commissioner's mailboxes this morning.

Comm. Young reported that all budget line items are in good shape through this meeting and no budget transfers are needed at this point.

E. Legislative Report

Comm. Young reported that the minutes were received from the State Association of Fire Districts meeting that was held in September.

7. OLD BUSINESS

A. Discussion on New Aerial Timeline & Financing

Comm. Young reported that the required advertising has been published for the special election to be held on December 16th. Comm. Young further reported that the ballot question and explanatory statement need to be finalized, which will be discussed following the discussion of the 2022 budget.

8. NEW BUSINESS

A. 2022 Budget Discussion

Comm. Young reviewed the 2022 proposed budget. Comm. Young expressed his opinion to approve a .043 per hundred tax rate in the 2022 budget, which is lower than the budgeted tax rate for 2021 but the same as the realized rate.

Following a discussion, Comm. Young requested that all Commissioners forward any changes as soon as possible in preparation for the special budget meeting in three weeks on December 6th.

B. Items Timely & Important

Comm. Young reported that he drafted the ballot question and an explanatory statement for the special election, as follows:

Ballot Question: "Shall the Commissioners of Fire District No. 2 in the Township of South Brunswick, County of Middlesex be authorized to purchase a fire truck for an amount not exceeding \$1,950,000 and secure lease-purchase financing relative to the fire truck purchase?"

Explanatory Statement: "The Fire District shall utilize \$1,100,000 in capital funds already accumulated in past budgets to substantially reduce the amount of borrowing costs relative to this purchase. The Fire District will then secure lease-purchase financing for the balance of the purchase costs not to exceed \$850,000."

Comm. Smith made a motion to approve the ballot question and explanatory statement, seconded by Comm. Wolfe.

Fire District Coordinator's Report November 15, 2021

- Alan Landscaping trimmed the bushes and landscaping at both stations on 10-25-2021.
- Station 20 was used as a polling location for the general election on 11-2-2021.
- Air & Gas Technologies was at Station 21 on 11-10-2021 to perform the 6-month preventive maintenance on the Bauer breathing air compressor.
- As I mentioned I would be doing in my report last month, I contacted three different vendors to provide quotes for the removal of approximately two-dozen trees around the site at Station 20. The low quote was from Miklos Tree Service in the amount of \$5,000.00. I have contacted Miklos and they will take down the trees as soon as they can fit us in. Asplundh Tree Service was on site on 11-12-2021 to take down the ash tree at the driveway into the site at the request of PSE&G, which will save the district money as quoted above.
