# REGULAR MEETING SOUTH BRUNSWICK TOWNSHIP BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS – DISTRICT #2 May 15, 2023

#### 1. CALL TO ORDER AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Spahr at 7:00 pm followed by a salute to the flag.

#### 2. NOTICE OF COMPLIANCE

#### 5. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

# A. April 17, 2023 Regular Meeting

Comm. Wolfe made a motion to approve the minutes of the April 17, 2023 regular meeting, seconded by Comm. Smith.

Roll call: Comm. Kazanski - yes, Comm. Smith - yes, Comm. Wolfe - yes, Comm. Young - yes, Chairman Spahr - yes. Motion Passed.

#### 6. PROFESSIONAL REPORTS

#### A. Fire Chief's Report

Chief Scott Smith reviewed the Fire Department's April 2023 activity report (see attached).

Chief Smith reported that the Fire Department stood-by at the High School during the landing of a Coast Guard helicopter as part of a presentation on April 26<sup>th</sup>.

Chief Smith reported that the Fire Department participated in a joint recruitment effort at the High School with the other township fire departments the evening of April 26<sup>th</sup>.

Chief Smith reported that the Fire Department held their annual dinner on May 6<sup>th</sup>. The Kendall Park Fire Company had a crew on stand-by during the event.

Chief Smith reported that the first meeting of the truck committee for the new engine was held earlier this month.

Chief Smith reported that Junior Firefighter Nish Shah turned 18 earlier this month and is now a probationary firefighter. Chief Smith also reported that the Department has a new junior firefighter, Yussef Ibrahim.

## **B.** District Coordinator's Report

Coordinator Scott Smith reviewed the May 2023 Coordinator's Report (see attached).

#### C. Insurance Chairman's Report

There was no insurance information to discuss.

# D. Treasurer's Report

Comm. Young reported that there were two deposits made since the last meeting. The first deposit was made on April 30<sup>th</sup> from South Brunswick Township Fire District #3 in the amount of \$44.99 for reimbursement of ID card maker supplies. The second deposit was made on May 10<sup>th</sup> from South Brunswick Township in the amount of \$264,000.00 for first quarter taxation. Comm. Young reported that the Township is still waiting on information from the State regarding the fire district election, and that the check was issued based on the 2022 tax rate.

Comm. Young reported that he distributed the latest financial reports to the Commissioner's mailboxes this afternoon.

Comm. Young reported that the draft audit report was received on April 25<sup>th</sup> and that the audit contains no findings or recommended corrective actions. Comm. Young further reported that the final report was received on May 11<sup>th</sup> and was forwarded to all of the Commissioners for review. The report will be discussed further under New Business.

#### E. Legislative Report

Comm. Young mentioned that the State Association of Fire Districts last met in March, but the minutes have not yet been posted to their website. The next meeting will be held in June.

#### 7. OLD BUSINESS

## A. Discussion on Paging System Replacement

Comm. Smith reported that he, Comm. Wolfe and Chief Smith met with the Township Mayor, Manager, Police Chief, and Police Dept. Liaison on May 9<sup>th</sup> to discuss the paging system replacement. Comm. Smith reported that the Mayor was very receptive and gave a verbal commitment to purchase the replacement pagers for the township fire departments and first aid squads. Comm. Smith also reported that the Mayor and Manager were in favor of funding the installation of traffic signal preemption equipment as part of the re-design of the Route 130/Route 522 intersection. Comm. Smith will follow-up with the Township Manager in the next month regarding this matter.

# B. Discussion on Capital Equipment Replacement Schedule

There was nothing to discuss on the topic this month.

#### 8. NEW BUSINESS

#### A. Discussion on Chief's Request for Operations Items

Chief Smith requested approval to purchase mounting brackets for the Hurst battery-powered rescue tools kept on the front-line engines at a cost not to exceed \$2,000.00.

Comm. Young made a motion to approve the purchase of the mounting brackets at a cost not to exceed \$2,000.00, seconded by Comm. Smith.

# B. Discussion on 2022 Audit Report

Comm. Young reported that the final audit report has been received and that there were no findings. Comm. Young further reported that the Board can pass a resolution accepting the audit report, and that all of the Commissioners will need to sign an affidavit certifying that everyone has reviewed the audit. Copies of the resolution and the affidavit will be sent to the DCA via the FAST portal, an audit synopsis will be published twice in the newspaper, and the audit report will be posted on the fire district website.

Chief Smith reported that he received an email from Kingston Fire Chief John Luck on May 14<sup>th</sup>, requesting a meeting with all three township fire chiefs and representatives from all three Boards of Fire Commissioners to discuss daytime firefighter manpower and shared services. After a discussion, all Board members were in favor of the meeting and Chief Smith will contact Chief Luck to schedule.

#### 9. VOUCHER LIST

Comm. Young reported that the voucher list has been amended to include two additional items: Item X to HFA in the amount of \$1,500.00; Item Y to Fire Dex, GW LLC in the amount of \$787.75.

# Fire District Coordinator's Report May 15, 2023

- Clearview Window Washing was at Station 20 on 4-20-2023 to clean the window blinds and the windows inside and out.
- Tower 201 went to Fire & Safety Services on 4-20-2023 to address several needed repairs that were identified during the annual service performed last year. The repairs were made and the truck was back in service the following day.
- Roth Bros. was at Station 20 on 4-22-2023 to perform the annual roof preventive maintenance.
- Antezak's Complete Service performed the carpet cleaning at both stations on 4-28-2023.
- Mar-Nic General Contractors was at Station 21 on 4-28-2023 to make several repairs to the chain link fence around the property. There was no charge for the work.
- A rep from the US Dept. of Agriculture placed (4) insect traps around the Station 20 site on 5-5-2023 to monitor for potential foreign pests that may be of concern for natural resources or agricultural commodities. The traps will be checked every (2) weeks and will be removed from the site in September.
- Engine 206 was taken to the Fire & Safety Services shop in South Plainfield on 5-8-2023 to address several needed repairs identified during the annual service performed last year.
- Brush 202 was taken to Malouf Ford in North Brunswick on 5-8-2023 to address an electrical issue. The fuel pump driver module & the 12-volt battery were replaced and the truck was back on 5-11-2023.
- Trugreen performed the second of three lawn treatments at both stations on 5-8-2023.
- Cummins Power Systems performed the 6-month preventive maintenance on the standby generators at both stations on 5-12-2023.
- All of the PPE ordered as part of the American Rescue Plan Firefighter grant has been received. I will be submitting the reimbursement paperwork via the online portal. On a related note, Governor Murphy announced on 5-2-2023 that he included an additional \$10 million towards the grant program in the fiscal year 2024 proposed state budget.
