REGULAR MEETING SOUTH BRUNSWICK TOWNSHIP BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS – DISTRICT #2 July 15, 2024

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Smith at 7:00 pm followed by a salute to the flag.

A. Fire Chief's Report

Chief Scott Smith reviewed the Fire Department's June 2024 activity report (see attached).

Chief Smith reported that the Fire Department held a live-burn drill at the Mercer County Fire Academy on June 27th.

Chief Smith reported that the Fire Department provided fire protection at the Township's Independence Day fireworks celebration on July 1st.

Chief Smith reported that the Fire Department gave an extrication demonstration for the Police Department's Youth Academy on July 12th.

Chief Smith reported that the Fire Department has a new probationary firefighter, Veeral Dass.

B. District Coordinator's Report

Coordinator Scott Smith reviewed the July 2024 Coordinator's Report (see attached).

C. Insurance Chairman's Report

Coordinator Smith reviewed the July 2024 Insurance Report (see attached).

D. Treasurer's Report

Comm. Young reported that there was one deposit since the last meeting. The deposit was made on June 24th in the amount of \$270,357.50 from South Brunswick Township for second quarter taxation. Comm. Young reported that the taxation check is again based on the 2023 tax rate.

Comm. Young reported that he distributed the latest financial reports to the Commissioner's prior to the meeting.

Comm. Young reported that he is going to start putting together financials for the 2025 budget.

E. Legislative Report

Comm. Young reported that the minutes of the June meeting of the State Association of Fire Districts are available for review.

7. OLD BUSINESS

There was no Old Business to discuss.

8. NEW BUSINESS

A. Discussion on Annual Hose Testing

Coordinator Smith reported that he received two quotes for the annual hose testing, with the low quote from Waterway, Inc. in the amount of \$3,480.00.

Comm. Spahr made a motion to approve the annual hose testing with Waterway, Inc. at a cost of \$3,480.00, seconded by Comm. Wolfe

B. Discussion on Creation of New Position

Chairman Smith reported that a draft job posting/description has been created for the position of Firefighter. There was a brief discussion on the requirements of the position, including age range, previous firefighting experience, and college experience. The topic will be discussed further at the August meeting.

C. Discussion on Fire Operations

Chief Smith reported that there was a joint meeting of Commissioners and Fire Chiefs from all three districts on July 2nd. Topics discussed included daily station assignments, daily turnout gear shuttling between stations, standardizing turnout gear specs, and mutual aid response practices. Chief Smith further reported that new accountability tags will be ordered so as to have different color tags for the three departments and the daytime staff.

Chief Smith reported that the daytime staff has designed a logo and would like to order t-shirts. Comm. Young requested that Fire District 3 pay for the shirts and submit invoices to the other districts for reimbursement.

Chief Smith reported that there was a discussion on the installation of traffic signal preemption equipment at the intersections along Route 1, as the daytime crew has to cross-over the highway frequently. A preliminary quote was received for the equipment and installation, and the State DOT has been contacted. Fire District 1 previously allocated funding for the installation of the equipment at the Route 1 and New Road intersection, and will be looking into the project further.

D. Resolution #24-29, Resolution Recognizing the 100th Anniversary of the Monmouth Junction Volunteer Fire Department
